
Online survey was shared with targeted stakeholders in the Southern and East African regions




OUTPUT 2: ZOOM WEBINAR




On 14th July 2020, about 60 participanats participated in a webinar, discussing the prospects of the hub in East Africa





OUTPUT 1: SURVEY RESULTS SUMMARY




